



ASANTEFORWARD: ASANTE ROGUE REGIONAL MEDICAL CENTER

Cost: \$420 million

Size: Six floors totaling 323,600 square feet

Location: North of existing bed tower between the tower and new parking garage

Purpose: To meet demands for health care amid a growing and aging population in nine counties in Southern Oregon and Northern California. The approximately 600,000 residents in our service area depend on ARMMC for neonatology, trauma, behavioral health and other specialized services

Construction: Begins October 2020, with completion in spring 2023

Highlights

- Increases inpatient and outpatient capacity, adds new services and allows more patients to stay near home for specialized diagnosis and treatment
- Improves access to care by cutting down on wait times for patient rooms, surgeries and procedures, and treatment in the Emergency Department
- Sites women's and children's services in one place, on the top two floors, and includes:
 - Designated space for an outpatient pediatric oncology clinic - including chemotherapy infusion space
 - 11 labor and delivery rooms, plus 2 surgical suites for C-section deliveries
 - 20 maternal child rooms
 - 16 private pediatric rooms and four "swing rooms" to provide a safe environment for children facing a mental health crisis
 - Private Neonatal Intensive Care Unit and special care nursery patient rooms to accommodate 32 babies
 - The state's first OB Emergency Department, with eight rooms for triage and recovery
 - Advanced medical therapies and specialized treatment for women of all ages
- Increases operating room suites from 15 to 20, including the addition of a second hybrid catheter lab/OR suite. All will be sized to accommodate today's advanced technology and staff
- Increases cath lab suites from four to six
- Increases our critical care beds from 44 to 64, with shell space for an additional 16 critical care rooms, effectively doubling the capacity of critical care beds to care for the sickest patients
- Adds 11 patient rooms in the Emergency Department for a total of 44
- Features new models of care to keep inpatient beds freed up for more acute patients:
 - A new Clinical Decision Unit in the Emergency Department for monitoring and treating those patients who may not require an inpatient stay, who await diagnosis or require observation to determine the best course of action
 - An Extended Recovery Surgical Unit for those patients requiring extended recovery (six to 48 hours) from surgery, but not an overnight stay on an inpatient unit
- Connects to existing tower on all six floors
- Includes shell space for future clinical growth
